# Redefining Perth Philanthropy Launch of 100 Women

A new collective giving initiative, 100 Women, is set to launch on Tuesday, 25 March with a goal to collect and distribute \$120,000 in small grants to girl's and women's causes each year.

The launch breakfast is expected to bring together more than 100 professional Perth women, led by Perth entrepreneur Alicia Curtis. The concept has already attracted the support of high profile Perth women who have become Ambassadors for 100 *Women*, including Maria Saraceni, Dr Erica Smyth and Rabia Siddique.

The 100 Women initiative is designed as a giving circle, whereby members pool their financial contributions in order to have a larger impact on the charitable causes they support.

"As the name indicates we aim to gather groups of 100 women (or men) who will commit to donating \$1,200 annually, so that together we can award \$120,000 to worthy grant recipients each year," Ms Curtis said.

100 Women will be calling for members to join the initiative from the 25 March, and is aiming to have the first 100 members signed up by September.

Charities supporting girl's and women's causes will be invited to submit applications for grants later this year, and *100 Women* members will have the unique opportunity to review these applications and vote for the grant submissions they feel will make the most impact to address issues affecting girls and women such as:

- Education
- Microfinance opportunities
- · Gender-based violence
- Sex trafficking
- Maternity mortality

All donations to *100 Women* will be fully tax deductible and 100 percent of donations received will be given out in grants. For more information on *100 Women*, visit 100women.com.au.

Program founder <u>Alicia Curtis</u> explains how the concept of *100 Women* was formed: "The idea was first inspired by reading the book <u>Half the Sky</u>, a book which raises awareness of the continued plight of women and how through investment and empowerment, real change can be achieved," Alicia said.
