





Big hART requests \$49,910 to deliver a leadership and cultural connection program for 25 young Aboriginal women at risk of or already disengaged from education and future employment, using digital arts and reconnecting with traditional knowledge.




Diversity Arts Australia requests \$50,000 to help improve the representation, participation and employment of Cultural and Linguistically Diverse (CaLD) women in the arts and creative industries. The Program will provide job readiness and employment pathways for 100 CaLD Women.



**National Program** 

Ember Connect requests \$50,000 to expand a 12-month mentoring initiative supporting 200 First Nations women nationwide in building social capital, economic independence, and personal growth.



Siem Reap, Cambodia

Free To Shine requests \$30,300 to increase the safety of 48 girls at risk of sex trafficking by mitigating immediate risks, providing emergency financial support and human rights education via a family-based model of care, so that these girls can remain in school.

Perth, Western Australia


Homeless Healthcare requests \$49,795 to provide additional assertive outreach nursing care to 10 pregnant women who are experiencing homelessness. The Together Program aims to provide stability during pregnancy and for the first two years of a newborn's life.

# Muslim Women's Support Centre WA (Inc)



Perth, Western Australia

Muslim Women's Support Centre WA requests \$45,000 to develop the Stronger Women Leaders Program enhancing the self-awareness, confidence and leadership capabilities of 40 women and girls from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds.



Western Sydney, NSW

The Warrior Woman Foundation requests \$50,000 to empower 30 women and girls transitioning from foster care to become successful, independent adults and break the generational cycle of trauma and disadvantage.



**National (WA/QLD/NSW)** 

Waves of Wellness Foundation requests \$49,760 to support nine unique mental health programs around Australia for a total of 117 at-risk women. The 8-week program includes group cognitive behaviour therapy plus a surf session, to connect women with peers and teach new skills for managing positive mental health.
